## **BUCKTHORN-MUNCHING GOATS COMING TO BURNSVILLE THIS FALL**

Burnsville has been battling buckthorn for many years, but this September it will enlist some new helpers – goats! Goats are known to be great at munching buckthorn and other woody species.

Earlier this year, the Burnsville City Council approved a pilot project in a two-acre area in Civic Center Park (near the Burnsville Ice Center). The pilot is meant to see if goats, along with other buckthorn-reduction techniques, can help control buckthorn in oak savanna restoration projects.

Large buckthorn and weedy trees have already been removed from the project area, and natural resources staff have seeded the area with native grasses. Starting in mid-September, goats will be brought in to eat the smaller buckthorn saplings, reducing the need for herbicides.

Goats are expected to be on site for several weeks. If successful, the goat grazing technique will be repeated for several years. The public is invited to stop by and check on the goats' progress once they have arrived on site!
